The 2012 Greater North Carolina Area Combined Federal Campaign is doing well - averaging \$100,000 a week - **BUT, we are not there yet.**

The goal this year is \$1,388,000 and with two weeks left in the campaign, we have not hit the \$1,000,000 mark yet. Employees in postal locations are contributing in record numbers. Non-postal accounts are showing nice increases.

Have you made your contribution yet this year? Here are some interesting facts to consider as we wind down the campaign:

- If you give \$1.00 per pay period (\$26 a year), you will provide vaccinations for 80 children - this is less than one soda a week!
- If you give \$5.00 per pay period (\$130 a year), you will provide yearly memberships for 30 at a Youth Club - can you give up one meal eating out a week?
- If you give \$10.00 per pay period (\$260 a year), you will be providing 57 well-balanced meals for Veterans - you and your family can skip one dinner out a week and YOU will feed 57 very deserving Veterans!
- If you give \$15.00 per pay period (\$390 a year), you will provide meals for 750 disaster victims - think how this would have impacted the victims of Sandy this past month.
- Finally, if you give \$20.00 per pay period (\$1,040 a year), you will provide the means to outfit 2 Guide Dogs - what an honor that would be!
